I am writing to inform you that I have a diagnosed medical condition known as **Neurofibromatosis (NF)**, a lifelong neuro-genetic disorder that may affect various aspects of my health and wellbeing during my time at university. NF includes conditions such as Neurofibromatosis Type 1 (NF1), NF2-related Schwannomatosis (NF2), and Schwannomatosis (SWN), each of which can present differently in different people.

While the effects of the condition vary from person to person, NF can impact concentration, physical stamina, coordination, and mental health. There may also be times when I need to attend medical appointments or manage symptoms that interfere with my academic schedule.

I’m sharing this information with you so we can begin a conversation about how the university might be able to support me, and to ensure that I’m able to manage my studies effectively while living with this condition. I would appreciate the opportunity to meet with you to discuss this further and to explore any reasonable adjustments or support services that may be available.
